Also in this issue, we update on our investigations into solicitors involved in the Post Office Horizon scandal, and separately the fall-out from cavity wall insulation claims brought by the SSB Group.

New rules on fees in financial mis-selling

New SRA rules which will restrict excessive fee-charging when firms make compensation claims for mis-sold financial products are to come into effect on 26 July. If your firm represents clients during financial service claims, then from 26 July there are maximum charges in place for



claim representation progressed through financial service redress schemes.

Immediately replace client account shortages, warning notice says

We have reminded firms of their duty to replace any shortages on client accounts immediately upon discovery in a new warning notice. Shortages might occur for a number of reasons – such as administrative errors or a cyber-attack - but whatever the cause, you have an obligation to replace immediately any missing money.
